WHAT IS THE SEMINAR ON THE AMERICAN REVOLUTION?

The Fort Ticonderoga Seminar on the American Revolution is a two-day, college-level seminar focusing on the military and cultural history of North America during the American Revolution. The Seminar offers a casual environment for speakers and participants to interact throughout the course of the weekend and presents a mix of established and new scholars.

WHAT DOES THE SCHOLARSHIP INCLUDE?

The Teacher Scholarship to the Seminar includes:
